The **Women Development Cell of Government Engineering College, Patan** successfully organized an awareness program on **1st August 2022**, focusing on empowering students with crucial knowledge about women's safety laws, support systems, and available helplines.

The event began with an insightful session on the **Domestic Violence Act, 2005**, delivered by **Wu.Po.Ko Pinkalben** from **Balisana Police Station**. Over two hours, students were educated about the legal protections provided under the Act, the rights of victims, and the available remedies for women facing domestic abuse. The session emphasized the importance of recognizing domestic violence in all its forms and encouraged students to become active citizens in reporting and preventing such issues.

Following this, **Wu.Po.Ko Sweetiben** from the **Mahila Police Station** conducted an informative session introducing the participants to the **SHE Team** — a dedicated women's safety unit operational in Gujarat. She elaborated on the objectives, functions, and immediate support mechanisms offered by the SHE Team to ensure the safety and dignity of women in public spaces.

The program concluded with a **live demonstration** by **Counselor Kaminiben** from the **Patan Abhayam 181 Helpline**. She showcased how the 181 Helpline operates, explained the step-by-step procedure of reaching out for help, and reassured students about the confidentiality and effectiveness of the services offered. The demonstration aimed to build confidence among the students to seek timely help and promote the helpline among their peers and families.

The event saw enthusiastic participation from **83 students**, reflecting their keen interest in understanding their rights and the safety mechanisms available. It effectively fulfilled its objective of sensitizing the youth towards critical social issues and empowering them with practical knowledge for personal and community safety.
